

SOS Signs of Suicide® Prevention Program for Middle and High Schools

A program that teaches students how to recognize and respond to signs of depression and suicide in themselves or a friend.

The SOS Program is the only school-based suicide prevention program to:

- Reduce self-reported suicide attempts by 40% in a randomized controlled study. (American Journal of Public Health, March 2004);
- Be selected by SAMHSA for its National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and Practices (NREPP).

SOS Signs of Suicide® Program

The SOS suicide prevention and depression screening program is designed for middle and high school students. The program is nationally recognized, easily implemented and cost effective.

The SOS Program teaches students how to identify the symptoms of depression and suicidality in themselves or their friends and encourages seeking help through use of the Acknowledge, Care, Tell (ACT) techniques.

Basic Steps to receive your free SOS Toolkit

The requirements for receiving your free kit from the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services include:

1. Creating your implementation team.
2. A signed memorandum of agreement with clearly identified training and implementation dates.
3. Participating in a one-hour suicide prevention training for school, staff or community members.
4. Completing an evaluation of results from using the kit.
